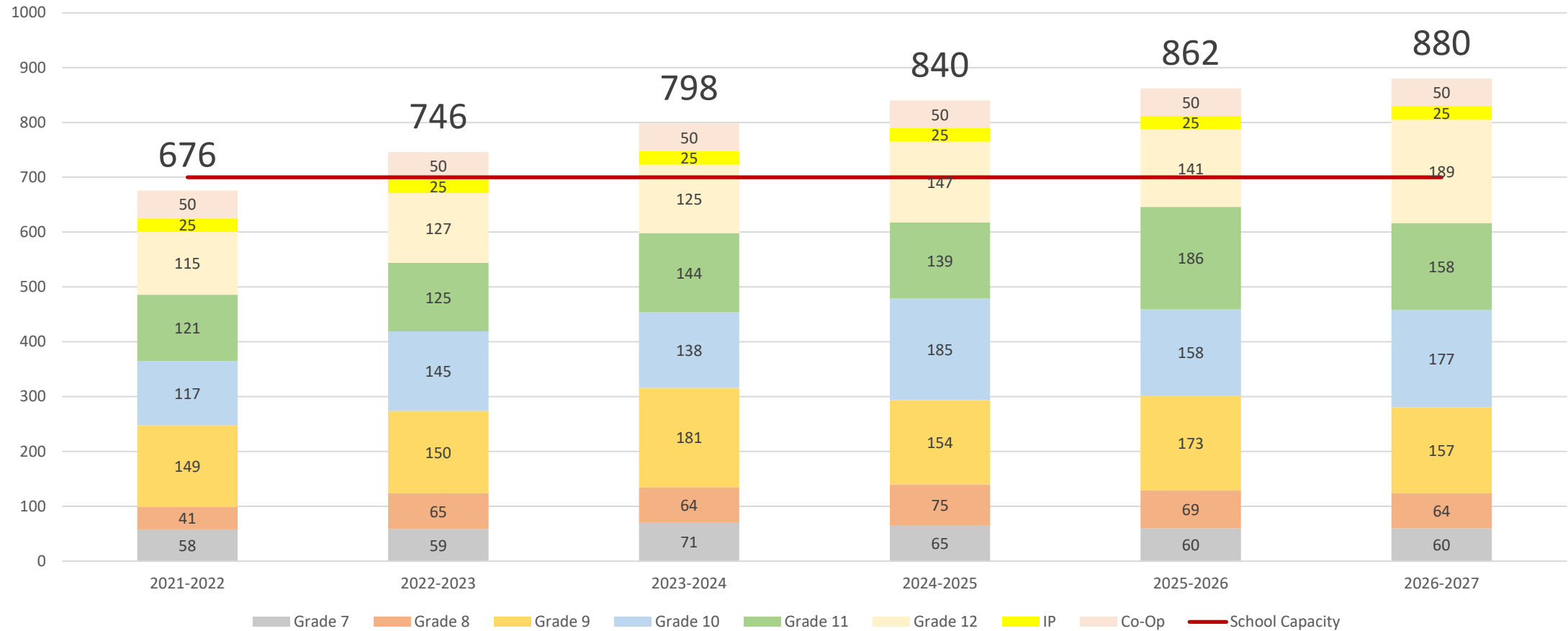

The Situation

- As Winnipeg continues to grow, LRSD welcomes more students into our schools each year.
- When École Sage Creek School (ÉSCS) opened in 2017, the division let the government know that we needed a second school to ensure all of the students who live in Sage Creek can go to elementary school in their community.
- Since we do not have a new school yet, the division had to come up with a number of solutions including:
 - Offering both French Immersion and English programs at ÉSCS (something that we don't normally do in LRSD).
 - Having Grades 7 & 8 ÉSCS students attend Collège Béliveau and Windsor Park Collegiate (beginning in Sept. 2019).
 - Having Grades 5 & 6 ÉSCS English program students attend Shamrock School (beginning in Sept. 2020).

Proposed Temporary Solution for the English Program in Sage Creek: Grades 5-8

- In 2022-2023, Shamrock School will serve Grade 5, 6, & 7 English program students residing in Sage Creek.
- In 2023-2024, Shamrock School will also serve Grade 8 students residing in Sage Creek.
- Students from Sage Creek are already attending Shamrock School for Grade 5 and 6 as a temporary solution. This was made possible because of a catchment change last year.



Proposed Solution: J.H. Bruns Collegiate

- Building on the proposed temporary solution of the English program Grade 5 to 8 students living in Sage Creek attending Shamrock School, LRSD is also proposing that they attend J.H. Bruns Collegiate for high school.
- Once a new school is opened in Sage Creek, the English program students living in Sage Creek would continue going to J.H. Bruns Collegiate for high school.
- The current Windsor Park Collegiate students from Sage Creek will continue alongside their WPC peers through to Grade 12.
- The kindergarten to Grade 8 French Immersion students will attend the new school and then move on to Collège Béliveau for Grades 9 to 12.

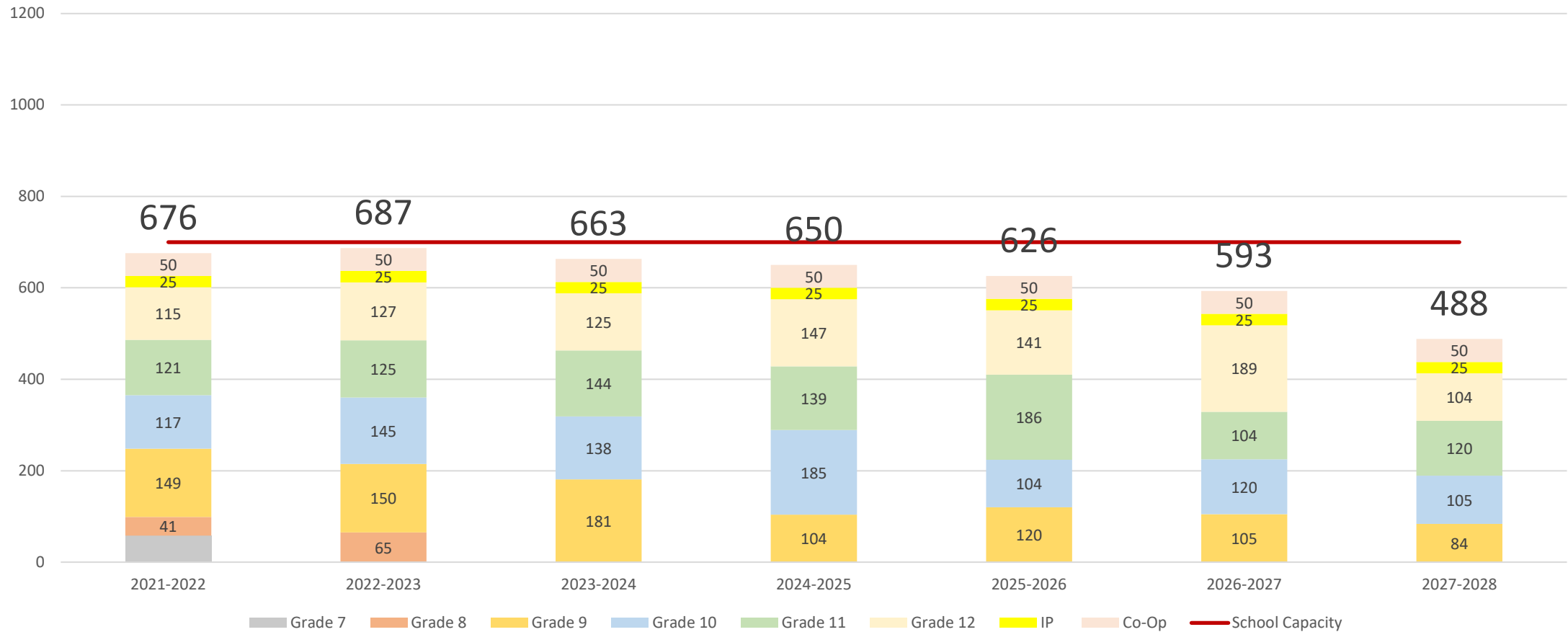


Long-Term Solution for the English Program in Sage Creek: Grades K-8

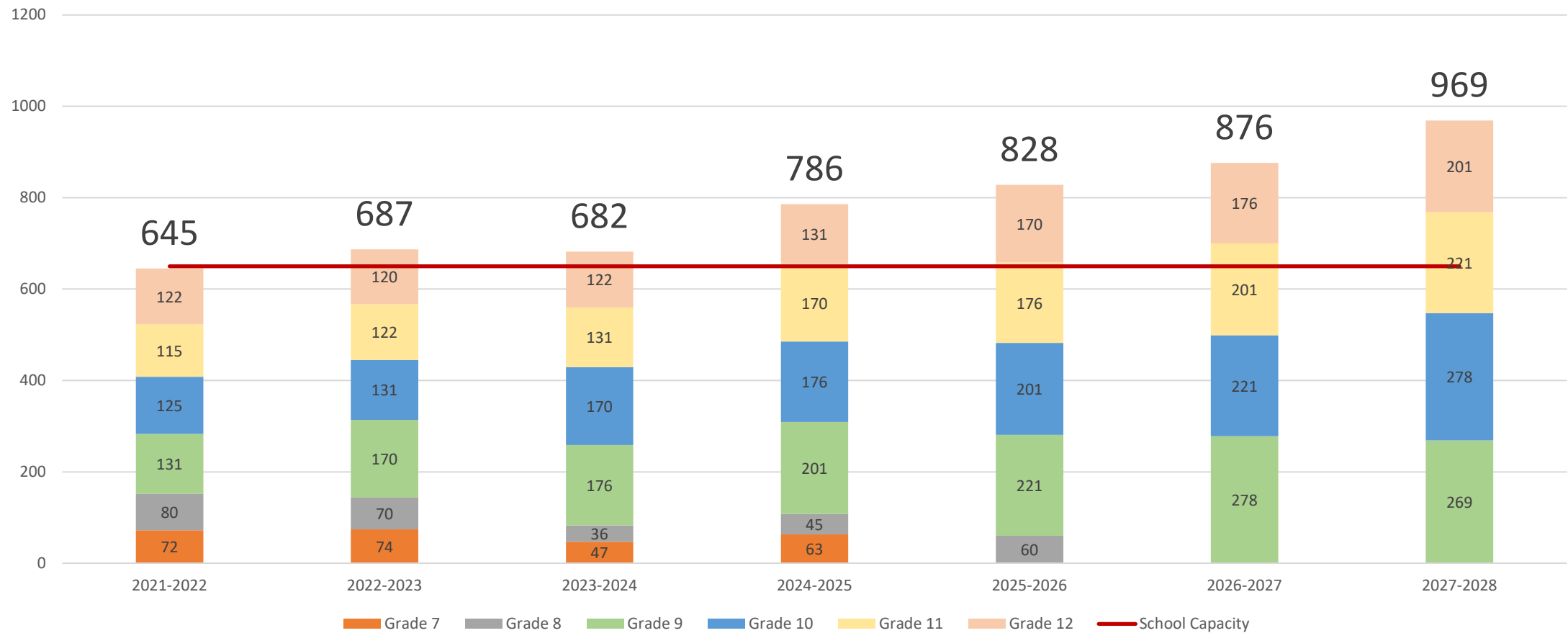
- Once a new school opens in Sage Creek, all of the English program students living in Sage Creek in kindergarten to Grade 8 will attend the current school in the community (rather than some of them attending Shamrock School).
- This is anticipated to happen in the 2025-2026 school year.

continuing at Shamrock for Gr 7-8 and transitioning to J.H. Bruns for Gr 9-12*



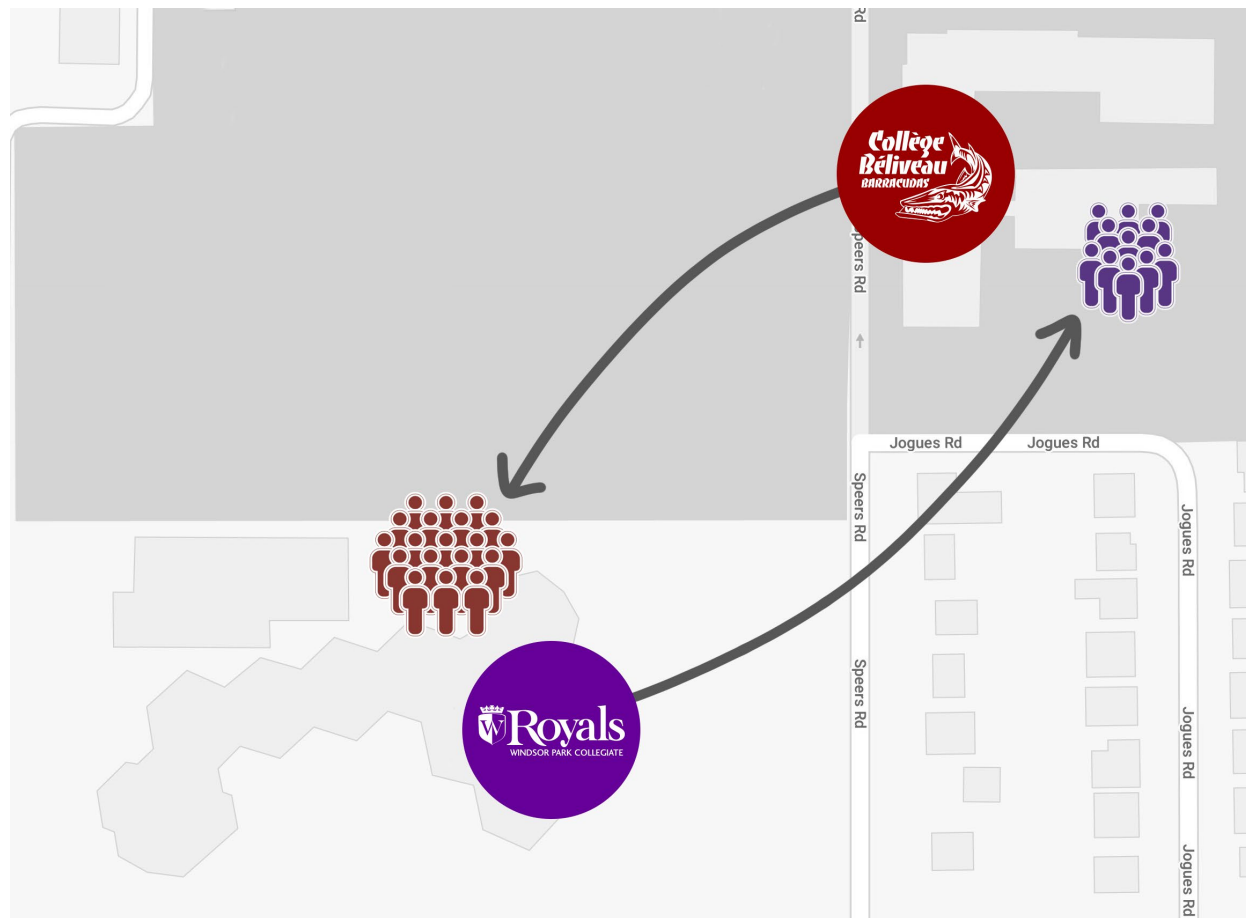
Current Enrolment Projection: Collège Béliveau

What to Anticipate:

- In the proposed solution, beginning in September 2024, all WPC students will learn in the current CB building.
- **GRADE 7:** If you are currently in Grade 7 at WPC, you will attend the current CB building starting in Grade 10.
- **GRADE 8:** If you are currently in Grade 8 at WPC, you will attend the current CB building starting in Grade 11.
- **GRADE 9:** If you are currently in Grade 9 at WPC, you will attend the current CB building for your final year of studies in Grade 12.
- **GRADES 10, 11 & 12:** You will remain at the current WPC building until the end of your studies.
- **INDIVIDUALIZED PROGRAMMING:** In the 2024-2025 school year, you will attend the CB building for the remainder of your studies.
- **CO-OP EDUCATION:** In the 2024-2025 school year, you will attend the CB building for the remainder of your studies.

What to Anticipate

- The division will work with students, staff and families to ensure students have access to the same opportunities they have currently and discuss new opportunities.
- The learning and well-becoming of students is then main focus.
- These two years will also be an important opportunity to continue making connections with students and staff at CB.



Next Steps

- The Board of Trustees will vote on these proposed solutions in the coming weeks.
- We will continue to share information and updates with students and staff.
