Why Summer Enrichment Program?

- Adds to student's educational experience in Canada
- Intended for students 12 – 18 years of age.
- Takes learning beyond the classroom
- Allows students to explore Canadian culture in and around Winnipeg
- Gives students an excellent environment in which to practice their English language skills with local Canadian students and certified Canadian teachers

Participants in the Summer Enrichment Program can expect:

- **Cultural enrichment and language development**
- **Lessons from certified Canadian teachers**
- **Communication with local Canadian students in the program**
- **A certificate for completing the program**
- **A full EAL (ESL) credit will be awarded to students upon completion of the program, if desired**

Themes

The summer's International Student Program is a two or three-week long course designed to offer international students the chance to experience Canadian culture. Each week revolves around a theme:

Activities

Students will participate in a variety of academic activities and field trips. A sample of the course programming includes:

Identity flag: Students will create unique flags to represent their interests, ideas, and traits.

Currency unit: Students will learn about Canadian money and visit the Canadian Mint.

French community: We will take a walking trip through St. Boniface to visit its many attractions and discuss the importance of the French community to Canada and Winnipeg.

Canadian citizenship: An overview of some of the concepts of Canadian citizenship, including democratic values.

Activities

Global identity: What is Canada's role in relation to the larger world? How does globalization bring us together or keep us apart? How can we work together across borders?

Traditions: We will explore unique Canadian traditions and those of students and their families.

The digital world: Students will use technology at the school's computer lab to create digital media projects such as movies and/or podcasts.
