### 3.2 News from Superintendent Michalik

Superintendent Michalik highlighted the following:

- I also want to congratulate our newly elected Board of Trustees and acknowledge individuals whom I journeyed with for a long time and who are not with us this evening. Previously, I acknowledged Louise Johnston, Josie Landry, and Neil Vadeboncoeur for their contributions. Tonight, I want to recognize and thank Robert Page for his many contributions and Tom Parker for his contributions to LRSD and the legacy school divisions.
- The Manitoba School Library Day was Oct. 24. I want to highlight that we are
  one of the very few school divisions that still has the role of the teacherlibrarian in our schools.
- Media Literacy Week 2022 took place on Oct. 24 to 28. Students, staff and families are making commitments and outlining expectations for media literacy.
- November is Financial Literacy Month in Manitoba to recognize ongoing education and awareness of financial literacy. In the upcoming months, the Board's dialogue will be focused on our own financial literacy.
- I'd also like to note that the Dakota Collegiate varsity football team is having an amazing season and we all want to cheer them on.

### 4. BOARD EDUCATION

## 4.1 Manitoba School Boards Association (MSBA) Fall Members Conference

The Chair encouraged trustees to join colleagues from across the province at the MSBA Conference and Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Dec. 1 and 2 for two days of learning, sharing, and association business. Dec. 1 will be focused on professional development for both new and seasoned trustees, and Dec. 2 will include the AGM, regional meetings, and other items related to association business. This will be an inperson meeting at the Victoria Inn Hotel and Convention Centre in Winnipeg.

#### 5. FINANCE AND AUDIT

### 5.1 Teachers' Idea Fund 2022-2023 Funding Announcement

Secretary-Treasurer Rudnicki shared the announcement made by the province regarding the 2022-2023 Teachers' Idea Funding Announcement supporting the following LRSD schools:

- Minnetonka School Integrating literacy and mental health, well-being and belonging with student voice and choice in the amount of \$67,250.
- St. George School Creating a wellness and movement room in the amount of \$47,735.
- Archwood School Creating safe spaces to support mental health teaching and learning in the amount of \$56,000.

#### 6. INFORMATION TO THE BOARD

### 6.1 New School Update - École Sage Creek & Bonavista

Superintendent Michalik shared an update regarding the construction of the new school that will support students enrolled in the French Immersion program, who live in Sage Creek and Bonavista. We had a great meeting this afternoon with representatives from the government reviewing the request for proposals (RFP) evaluation criteria. Assistant Superintendent Anderson confirmed that the province's RFP requesting design services closed on Nov. 1. The process will be complete in one week and the successful architectural firm will be announced for the design of the school for École Sage Creek & Bonavista. As part of the process, we will be meeting with the Parent Advisory Council (PAC) at École Sage Creek School on Thursday, Nov. 4.

### 6.2 Collège Jeanne-Sauvé Renovation and Addition Update

Superintendent Michalik advised that the renovation and addition at Collège Jeanne-Sauvé are moving along without issue and on schedule. Amarbeer Bhandari, Director of Maintenance, Facilities and Transportation, advised that the science classroom renovations will hopefully be completed by Jan. 15. We await receipt of the hollow core, currently being manufactured for the addition. In December, we anticipate the structural steel will start to go up and take shape. We are still on target to open in September of 2023.

# 6.3 J.H. Bruns Collegiate Renovation and Addition Update

Assistant Superintendent Murray shared that the community had the chance to meet the architect and look at three possible designs at the Oct. 20 Community Consultation. We are amplifying the feedback process for the J.H. Bruns community which includes the partner elementary schools and families in Sage Creek. Staff at each of those schools had the chance to dialogue during staff meetings. Assistant Superintendent Murray will also be meeting with student leaders at these schools, and we will do a deep analysis of location and to make the best possible plans for students. We are planning a student-led Open House on Nov. 16 which will include tours of the school and an opportunity to provide more feedback on the design options. The architects will then review the feedback and provide a final design option in December for submission to the Province of Manitoba.

### 6.4 Windsor Park Collegiate Renovation Update

Assistant Superintendent Murray shared that we are at the initial planning stages of putting together a timeline for submitting a Class D design for cost estimate to the province by March. We can confirm that Prairie Architect will be joining us to develop the plan for Windsor Park Collegiate. After consultation with school teams, we will bring

forward a first look at those high-level designs, hopefully in January. Staff will have a first glance at the Collège Béliveau building the week of Nov. 1.

## 6.5 Collège Béliveau Renovation Update

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared that we are meeting with the staff task force at Collège Béliveau and that team will be visiting the Windsor Park Collegiate building. There was a presentation during the October staff meeting where ideas were shared. The division is working closely with Prairie Architects and the school team.

### 6.6 Marion School Renovation and Addition Update

Assistant Superintendent Cormack advised that there are two projects happening at Marion School; the envelope and elevator renovation and the addition project which is in the RFP process. In terms of the envelope and elevator project, the steel angle work, ledger and installation station are ongoing on the west side of the building. The piles for the west entry ramp and stairs have been installed. The universal change room is now complete. The envelope renovation includes replacing all the windows on both floors and the windows have started to arrive.

## 6.7 École Varennes Update

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared an update regarding École Varennes. The division contracted a third-party service to conduct a building condition assessment, which was built in 1950 as a flood relief school to help out other buildings that were damaged. When it was originally constructed, the school had a 25-year life expectancy. The outcome of the building assessment was that given the long list of repairs and enhancements required, it made more sense to rebuild. For the past few months, architects have been working on plans to design a new school building constructed in the schoolyard, located close to St. Mary's Road. Students would continue to occupy the existing building, during the construction phase, and when the new school is ready, the existing building would be torn down and that area would serve as either a playground or parking, depending on the design. We have received initial drawings from the architects and on Nov. 8 we will be sharing three options with the community. This will be a starting point for discussion. We will be consulting with students and staff in November and based on their feedback, the architects will be incorporating their refinements in these options.

## 6.8 Governance Journey 2022 Guidebook

Superintendent Michalik shared the Governance Journey 2022 Guidebook and answered trustee questions.

### 6.9 Educators' Summit Update

Superintendent Michalik shared an update on the LRSD Educators' Summit and made reference to the professional learning day planned for staff on Nov. 25.
